As announced in my previous newsletter, I have the honor to have been invited to exhibit my photos at the Mark Rothko Art Center in Latvia. Daugavpils, formerly called Dvinsk, is the born city of the famous naturalized American painter Mark Rothko. This center of art, situated in a former Russian arsenal, is a magnificent renovated building which welcomes around thirty annual exhibitions and several symposia dedicated to painting, photography, sculpture and ceramic.



My exhibition *Tribute* has a place of honor in the museum because it is situated facing the rooms dedicated to Mark Rothko. Kate and Christopher Rothko, the children of the artist, give to the museum 4 to 6 original works which are renewed every 3 years. The works are accompanied with a presentation very documented on the bibliographic and esthetic route of Mark Rothko. A real national pride!


My choice of photos for this exhibition was in connection with my sensibility for the pictorial work of Mark Rothko. Beyond the shape and the colors, Rothko especially enjoyed confronting his paintings with the human feelings. "Silence is so accurate" he said. An almost religious experience which he felt himself when he painted. The treatment and the strength of colors, the apparent simplicity of a subtle and complex work, as well as the contemplative character of the paintings of Mark Rothko are elements which have been guiding me since several years and where from arises my series *Coloured Meditation* largely present in the exhibition.

YVESULLENS **TRIBUTE**

After a career in the telecommunications sector, Yves Ullens decided to dedicate himself entirely to his lifelong passion: photography. As a teenager, he had developed his first prints and learned the ropes of lab work in the dark room of his grandmother, herself a noted photographer and filmmaker. During a year's study in the United States, he took technical lessons with two professional photographers who taught him about the importance of observation above all else. Yves Ullens developed an experienced eye and gained a lot of background theory about photography by assiduously attending contemporary art galleries and fairs.

His artistic vocation revealed itself rather late in his life pursuant to the unexpected outcome of a photograph taken during a stay in Turkey. An accidental blur awakened his innate sense of abstraction and plays on light. It was the outcome of a well-defined choice of subject matter, lighting, strict framing and a controlled capture of the image with the camera in motion. This photograph marks the start of Yves Ullens' quest for personal creativity. Little by little, Yves Ullens developed his photographic technique that involves free movement of the camera, almost a dance, when he lets himself be guided by his emotions and his imagination. The subject matter of the photographs is inspired by the artists travels and day-to-day life: an object, a landscape, a particular material... It becomes an unexpected pictorial composition, bright, vibrant and colourful, in many ways akin to a painting, with the brush being replaced by the lens of the camera; the artist takes a deliberately aesthetic and sensorial approach to his works. Each photographic composition features a visual sensibility that is made enhanced by the artist's perpetual quest for capturing the vital energy of light and of colours, transcending the conventions and the rules of traditional photography.

There are numerous references to painting in Yves Ullens' work. The optical effects and the geometric compositions of certain images such as *Blue Floating Shapes into Red, Disco Lights or White Light Sculpture* evoke the kinetic works of Victor Vasarely or Bridget Riley. His more recent works in the Coloured Meditation series evoke the Coloried Paintings of Mark Rothko, the American painter, who used to express himself by means of one or more colours, with vague contours, laid flat on the canvas. The abstract photographs of Yves Ullens explore new aesthetic avenues and invite the viewer to embark on a sensory journey. Each of the



From November 9, MM Gallery will unveil for the first time to the public my new series of photographs *Urban Traces Project*. This set of prints is a continuation of an aesthetic reflection on abstraction, focusing in particular on the effects of structures, textures and colors drawn from the urban environment. My gaze has focused on insignificant details and yet very present in our daily life. *Urban Traces Project* are detailed images of pedestrian crossings or ground markings of megacities around the world (New York, Paris, Brussels, London, Barcelona, Shanghai ...). At first glance, these traces on the ground may seem very similar and yet by looking more closely at these urban footprints, I tried to unveil a great variety of colours and shapes related to their wear, abrasion or gap, disappearing little to little in the movement of the urban density. These successive layers in asphalt then appear as an archaeological mirror of our urban lives. A spiritual connection with the journey of my grandmother, Marie-Thérèse Ullens, who was a traveler, photographer, filmmaker and archaeologist.


I have been working on the *Urban Traces Project* series since 2005 in parallel to my abstract photographic work. In this series, abstraction is no longer obtained thanks to the movement of the camera but by the subject himself. Always looking for light and colour, I compose my images in reference to painting. The series of traces is particularly reminiscent of the art brut and especially the poetic experiments of Jean Dubuffet in the 50s. A poetry picking from the ephemeral textures of our daily lives. Through this exhibition, I invite you to dream and let your imagination and your emotions wander into the abstract urban forms unveiled on a large scale.

The exhibition will be accompanied by a publication.

A Belgian architectural firm contacted me as part of an exclusive and innovative property project. They entrusted me with the dressing of the wall of the main entrance which serves three large luxurious lofts in a building made of revolutionary materials. The dominant tones of the building are gray, black and white. For this project, I created an entirely exclusive work in bright colours with predominantly red and orange which contrast with the sobriety of the tones of the architecture of the building. And the vertical rhythm of the image fits in with the clean lines of the entrance. To my credit, the title of the work *Balanced Rainbow* became, at the request of the contractor and the architect, the name of the residence.

Another more monumental and outdoor project is under construction for another housing building in Brussels. To follow in my next newsletter ...

I want to develop this activity related to architecture and interior decoration, with the help of my new assistant, Alexia Van de Velde, who has just joined my team and with whom I started working on different projects .






This year, the *Kids' Hope* association is organizing a charity exhibition for the benefit of Cité Joyeuse - the orphan's home, which welcomes children in difficulty. A very nice initiative to which I am very pleased to participate with the exhibition organized at the Faienceries of Gien in Sablon from 9 to 13 November 2017.

To find out more: L'Asbl *Kids'Hope* was founded in 1990 to provide direct assistance to La Cité Joyeuse - Le Foyer des Orphelins, Center Arnaud Fraiteur. La Cite Joyeuse was founded in 1914 by Ovide Decroly, Nicolas Smelten and Charles de Gronckel, pioneers of the new school, to give a home to the orphans of the 1914-18 war. Over time, the population of men has changed by force of circumstances, welcoming children disrupted by inadequate family situations, morally or emotionally abandoned, delayed, traumatized. More than 250 children, aged 2 to 18, occupy seven family-owned lodges in a seven-hectare park on the Osseghem plateau in Molenbeek-Saint-Jean.

This exhibition is a Must for lovers of colour!

"This exhibition tackles the fundamental question of artists' perception of colors, from an essentially sensorial point of view. Source of pleasure, symbol of power, catalyst of memory, color is for the artist a powerful tool that affects our emotions, well beyond our thoughts. The 400 works presented are mainly from the collections of the National Museum of Ceramics in Sèvres and exceptional loans from large public collections, in particular the National Museum of Modern Art - Center Pompidou (about fifty works), Decorative Arts, the National Arts Center, the Mobilier National and the CIRVA. Many loans artists, galleries and collectors complete the selection of works presented in the exhibition."
